Dynabook Laptop Components Classified as Requiring Selective Treatment

Dynabook would like to communicate the method of identifying and removing components contained in Dynabook notebook products, including but not limited to the **Portege X40-G** model, that requires selective treatment based on the European WEEE Directive, Directive 2012/19/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council on waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE).

All of the instructions provided within this letter can be reviewed in greater detail within the **Portege X40-G** Series Maintenance Manual.

Tools Required

In order to remove internal components of the **Portege X40-G** some tools from the list below may be required located in **Chapter 4 Replacement Procedures** of the **Dynabook Maintenance Manua**

For your safety and the safety of the people around you, it is important that you use Electrostatic Discharge (ESD) equipment. Correctly utilizing of the equipment increases the percentage of successful repairs and saves on the cost of damaged or destroyed parts. The following equipment is required for disassembly and assembly.

- One Philips screwdriver with type 0 bit (for S-THIN HEAD screws)
- One Philips screwdriver with type 1 bit (for screws other than above)
- One flat-blade screwdriver (for removing the CPU)
- Tweezers (for lifting screws)
- ESD mats (lay on work table or floor)
- An ESD wrist strap and heel grounder
- Anti-static carpet or flooring
- Air-ionizers in highly static sensitive areas
- Antenna coaxial cable disconnector
- Special syringe (for applying grease)

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1. Removing the Lithium Ion Battery (Main Battery, No coin cell battery)

Please refer to the information below for instructions regarding the identification and removal of the lithium ion battery. Further maintenance instructions can be found in section 4.11 of the

Portege X40-G Maintenance Manual. Some tools are required in order to remove this component. Once removed, these components should be recycled as per local requirements.

To remove the battery, the base assembly must be removed first:

4.11.1 Removing the Cover Assembly and Base Assembly





Figure 4-4 Removing the Base Assembly (1)

To remove the Base Assembly, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-4 to Figure 4-5.

- 1. Close the display panel and turn the computer face down.
- 2. Remove the **BOTTOM CUSHION M** on the center of the Base Assembly.
- 3. Remove the following screws securing the Cover Assembly and the Base Assembly.
- 4. Separate the **Base Assembly** and **Cover Assembly** while releasing the **latch**

4.12.1 Removing the Battery pack


To remove the battery pack, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-6 and Figure 4-7.



Take care not to short circuit the terminals when removing the battery pack. Similarly, do not drop, knock, scratch, disassemble, twist, or bend the battery pack.


- 1. Disconnect the **BATTERY HARNESS** from the connector **CN8021** on the SYSTEM board.

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2. Removing the SSD

To remove the SSD the **mainboard** must be removed **first**. Please refer to the information listed in section **4.22** of the **Portege X40-G Series Maintenance Manual** to check how the mainboard is removed.

Please refer to the information below for the removal of the SSD.

One Philips screwdriver with type 1 bit will be required to remove the screws indicated in the locationsbelow. Once removed, these components should be recycled as per local requirements.

4.23.1 Removing the SSD


To remove the SSD, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-32.



Take care not to press on the top or bottom of a SSD. Pressure may cause the data loss or damage to the device.

1. Remove the the following screw and disconnect the **SSD** from the connector **CN1910** on the SYSTEM board.







3. Removing the LCD and Printed Circuit / Wiring Boards

Beside the LCD and the main PCB, there are further **small PCBs and components** which are in thescope of the WEEE Directive. The removal of these components is described in detail in the **chapter 4** of the associated maintenance manual.



Replacement Procedures

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4.11 Cover Assembly and Base Assembly

4.11.1 Removing the Cover Assembly and Base Assembly





Figure 4-4 Removing the Base Assembly (1)

To remove the Base Assembly, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-4 to Figure 4-5.

- 1. Close the display panel and turn the computer face down.
- 2. Remove the **BOTTOM CUSHION M** on the center of the Base Assembly.
- 3. Remove the following screws securing the Cover Assembly and the Base Assembly.

4.11.2 Installing the Base Assembly

4.12 Battery pack

4.12.1 Removing the Battery pack


To remove the battery pack, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-6.



Take care not to short circuit the terminals when removing the battery pack. Similarly, do not drop, knock, scratch, disassemble, twist, or bend the battery pack.

- 1. Disconnect the **BATTERY HARNESS** from the connector **CN8021** on the SYSTEM board.
- 2. Remove the following screws and the battery pack.

4.12.2 Installing the Battery pack

To install the battery pack, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-6.



The lithium ion battery pack may explode if not fitted, operated, handled, or disposed correctly. Dispose always the used battery pack in accordance with the laws and ordinances of your local authority. Use only the batteries approved by Dynabook.

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Check the battery's terminals visually. If they are dirty, wipe them clean with a dry cloth.

- 1. Set the battery pack to the COVER ASSY and secure it with the screws.
- 2. Connect the **BATTERY HARNESS** to the connector **CN8021** on the SYSTEM board.

4.13 Memory module

4.13.1 Removing the Memory module

To remove the memory module, follow the steps as detailed below:



Do not touch the connectors on the memory module or on the computer. Dust or stains on the connectors may cause memory access problems. Never press hard or bend the memory module.

1. Open the left and right **latches** outside and remove the **memory module(s)**.




Figure 4-7 Removing the memory module(s)



4.13.2 Installing the Memory module

To install a memory module, follow the steps as detailed below:

1. Align the notch of the memory module with that of the memory slot and gently insert the module into the slot at about a 30 degree angle before holding it down until the latches on either side snap into place.

After installing the memory module, make sure that the memory module is secured with the left and right latches.








Figure 4-11 Removing the LED board






Figure 4-12 Removing the Speaker (1)





Figure 4-15 Removing the Speaker (4)













Figure 4-21 Removing the 3G module (1)





Figure 4-22 Removing the 3G module (2)











Figure 4-29 Removing the system board (1)









Figure 4-35 Installing the Power button (1)






Figure 4-37 Removing the Click pad (2)








Figure 4-42 Installing the keyboard (1)












Figure 4-47 Installing the keyboard (6)









Figure 4-49 Removing the LCD unit (1)



Figure 4-50 Removing the LCD unit (2)






Figure 4-54 Installing the LCD unit (1)




Figure 4-45 Installing the LCD unit (2)






Figure 4-58 Removing the camera module (2)



- 1. Stick new Wireless antennas in place.
- 2. Arrange the **Wireless antenna cables** in place, and secure them with the INSU SQUARE and insulators on the LCD cover.

4.28.4 Installing the Camera module

To install the camera module, follow the steps below and refer to Figure 4-57 to Figure 4-60.

- 1. Peel off a protection sheet from a new camera module.
- 2. Stick the new camera module to the LCD cover.

- 3. Connect the **HD web CAM FPC/IR CAM FPC** to the connector on the camera module and stick the HD web CAM FPC/IR CAM FPC to the LCD cover in place.
- 4. Stick two pieces of **AL TAPE** on the new camera module.



AC Adapter, External cables provided with the AC adapter and USB cables

The AC adapter as well as all external cables provided with the notebook including the AC adapter cables and USB cables should be segregated and sent for shredding.

The following components contained within the AC adapter potentially contain hazardous substances and require special handling:


- Printed Circuit Board >10 cm²
- Capacitor >25 mm in height








